## Declaration

## on Self-Regulation in the Field of Artificial Intelligence in Ukraine

We, the companies that have signed this Declaration, understanding the important and increasingly significant role of artificial intelligence in all areas of public life, are aware that, depending on the circumstances of its use, the level of technological development, and other factors, artificial intelligence systems can pose risks and cause harm to society and citizens.

At the same time, aiming to ensure a proper balance between protecting citizens' rights and safeguarding against potential risks posed by artificial intelligence systems on the one hand, and the interests of the relevant business sector and the development of innovations on the other, we emphasize the need to seek approaches and methods for regulating AI systems that adequately consider the interests of domestic businesses.

In this regard, and wishing to proactively ensure an adequate level of protection for citizens' rights when interacting with artificial intelligence, particularly through the responsible development, implementation, and use of relevant (own) AI systems, we emphasize the important role of co-regulation and self-regulation tools for social relations in the digital sphere, especially in the field of artificial intelligence.

Taking into account the various roles of the signatory companies within the life cycle of the relevant AI systems and considering the different possible approaches to the responsible development, implementation, and use of AI systems, we declare our intent to make appropriate efforts to:

Utilizing a risk-based approach throughout the lifecycle of relevant AI systems

Adhering to the principles of safety and reliability for the respective AI systems

Ensuring privacy and protection of personal data during the lifecycle of relevant AI systems

Upholding the principles of fairness and justice in the context of AI systems

Ensuring transparency and explainability of relevant AI systems

Promoting the implementation of mechanisms for human oversight and monitoring of AI systems

Encouraging leadership and raising awareness about Al systems

Complying with intellectual property protection laws in the context of relevant AI systems

The aforementioned list of principles is neither final nor exhaustive and may be subject to further revision by the companies signing this Declaration.

Emphasizing the important role of self-regulation tools in ensuring an adequate level of protection for citizens' rights in the field of artificial intelligence, we declare our intent to continue working on the responsible development, implementation, and use of AI systems, particularly by participating in the development of a Voluntary Code of Conduct for the ethical and responsible use of artificial intelligence in business (the Code).

To achieve this goal, we express our intention to contribute to the formation and operation of the initiative group responsible for drafting the Code, including by delegating a responsible individual to participate in the group, ensuring that this person is sufficiently engaged in the process, with the aim of completing the Code within three months from the date of signing this Declaration.
